

Director's Note

Following tonight's curtain call, there will be a final musical number. The rest of the students in the Summer Performing Arts Company will join the cast to perform "I Sing the Body Electric." This symbolic song ties the entire program together. It has different meanings to different students, but a common theme can be found in the literal text. The students are celebrating not only the arts, but their growth in the arts yet to come. They will go on to create their own tomorrow as they continue in music and theatre over the next few years. The song also symbolizes the passing of a class. This is the last summer program in which the class of 1999 will be able to participate. This "passing of the tradition" is represented by the two soloists selected to sing. Abby Lochner, a senior, will sing the first verse then turn the spotlight over to eighth-grader Chase Burkhardt.

A SPA Tradition

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West Side Story is a classic. It was originally conceived as an updated musical version of the "Romeo and Juliet" story. The setting is the lower West Side of New York City in the late 1950's. The conflict is racial. Tony is white and Maria is a Puerto Rican immigrant. The violence happens between two street gangs.

The score and the book are connected in a very unique way. The music and the dance tell the story as actively as the dialogue does. We know that when Leonard Bernstein, Stephen Sondheim, Arthur Laurents, and Jerome Robbins created it, they did it all together. The dance fits the music perfectly, or the music fits the dance. It is a unique marriage of movement, music, lyrics, and story. No element stands alone. This is the fact that made *West Side Story* the landmark in musical theatre history that it is. The team that originally created it knew exactly what they were doing. As directors we found very little to cut. Everything was put in the score for a purpose. The theme of *West Side Story* is timeless. The world is not a perfect place. We can never try hard enough to change that fact.


