DIRECTOR'S NOTES

The Boy Friend (sometimes misspelled The Boyfriend) is a musical comedy by Sandy Wilson. The musical's original 1954 London production ran for 2,078 performances, making it briefly the third-longest running musical in West End or Broadway history (after Chu Chin Chow and Oklahoma!) until it was surpassed by Salad Days. This musical marked Julie Andrews' American stage debut.

Set in the carefree world of the French Riviera in the Roaring Twenties, The Boy Friend is a comic spoof of 1920s shows (in particular early Rodgers and Hart musicals such as The Girl Friend). Although the storyline itself is purposefully weak (because it's a spoof) it is a popular choice for amateur and student groups.

SPA chose The Boy Friend for a variety of reasons- it can showcase talented soloists, showcase the chorus with larger numbers, and finally, the show can accommodate the massive amount of dancers we have in these two grades.

One thing we didn't anticipate, was having a cast of 87 students, all in grades 9 and 10. Major kudos goes to Amy Sanner and all of her costumers. 87 students need at least three different costumes, and nearly all have been built from scratch. Each costume took about 3-4 hours to design, measure, cut, sew, fit and adjust. We still don't know how the costume people do it.

In addition, how do you place 87 students on the stage and not have it look like chaos? How do you leave enough stage space for dance numbers? How does every kid get a little moment to be front and center? How do you get 87 fourteen and fifteen year-olds to listen to you at the same time during rehearsals? Where do you put 85 people when there are only two on stage? Where do we to put the pit orchestra? All of these logistics were new to us this year- and we did our best to solve each issue as best we could.

Finally, each cast has its own personality. Some are goofy, some argue, some are tuned out. The directing team all agrees that this cast was extremely polite, hardworking, talented and just a lot of fun. Great job parents!

Thank you so much for choosing to attend this production. The cast, crew and staff hope you enjoy what we've prepared for you.

What could be better than students cheering FOR each other, not against. That is a wonderful part of teaching in the Arts. SPA allows the opportunity for students to "act well", both on stage and off stage. SPA gives students the opportunity to succeed – each student finding their moment to shine; each student being able to "make a difference".

The Kids of Summer are Back! They have a performance to share with you tonight. They also have a story to tell about all that is SPA that is not a part of tonight's performance.
