

DIRECTOR'S NOTES



Welcome! As you prepare yourself for tonight's production, you are perhaps expecting the classic Shakespearean piece? Probably composed in 1595 or 1596, *A Midsummer Night's Dream* is one of Shakespeare's early comedies. Scholars believe that Shakespeare wrote it for a marriage celebration. As

a debut directing piece with SPA—there's a twist! How better to celebrate summer and a play about love then playing with the time frame of the 60s or the "Summer of Love" as it has been called in San Francisco. The main plot involves two sets of couples (Hermia & Lysander and Helena & Demetrius) whose romantic cross-purposes are complicated by their entrance into the play's fairyland woods where the King and Queen of the Fairies (Oberon & Titania) preside and the impish folk character of Puck plies his trade. Another set of characters – Nick Bottom and his bumptious band of struggling actors – stumble into the main doings when they go into the same enchanted woods to rehearse a play. If *A Midsummer Night's Dream* can be said to convey a message, it is that the creative imagination is in tune with the supernatural world, and is best used to confer the blessings of nature upon mankind and marriage. On behalf of all of us that make up the cast, crew, and administration, we welcome you to our version of *A Midsummer Night's Dream*.


HOW DO YOUR DONATIONS HELP?
