

Director's Notes



Consider yourself at home this evening as we prepare to entertain you with the classic 1837 Charles Dickens' tale entitled Oliver Twist. The musical is based on Dickens second novel in his writing and was interestingly originally distributed in monthly installments in what was called the Pickwick Papers from 1837-1839. It is a story of an orphan boy named Oliver who was abandoned to a workhouse as an infant or so Mr. Bumble tells us. Historically the workhouses were a reality in London during the late 1800's. They were created thru the Poor Law Amendment Act of 1834, allowing the poor a place to abandon their children that they could not afford to feed. The story of Oliver follows a lifestyle of the seamy underside of the London criminal world.

Unlike the merry world of the upper class of London, England, Dickens was severely criticized for introducing criminals and other evil characters in Oliver--he was quoted as stating in 1858, "I saw no reason... why the very dregs of life, should not serve the purpose of a moral". A man ahead of his time, we only have to turn on the television or attend the newest action film to see many of these same elements. Watch tonight's performance for the moral that is brings to your family.
