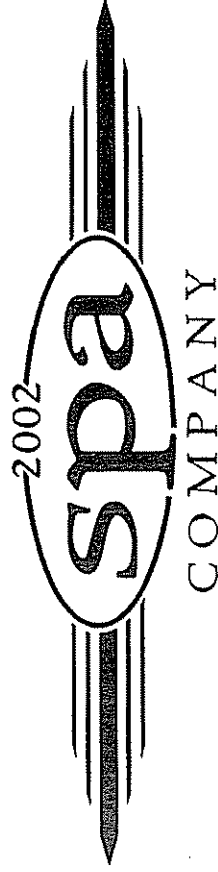

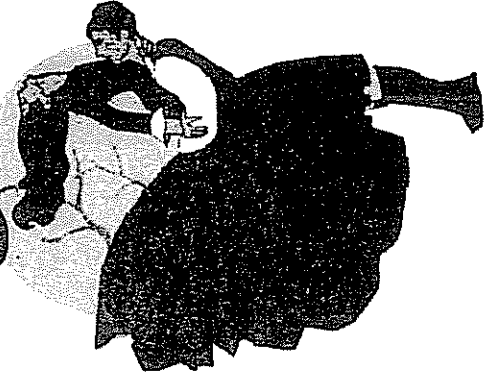

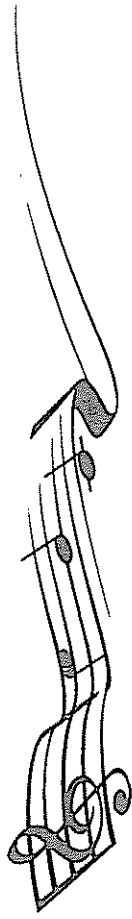

The song also symbolizes the passing of a class. This is the last summer program in which the class of 2003 will be able to participate. This "passing of the tradition" is represented by the two soloists selected to sing. Chase Burkhardt, a senior, will sing the first verse then turn the spotlight over to Devin Levang, a student new to the SPA company. *"And in time we will all be stars."*

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Brigadoon was first performed on March 13, 1947 at the Zeigfeld Theatre in New York City. It was the first successful collaboration of Alan Jay Lerner and Frederick Lowe, the pair who later created *My Fair Lady*, *Paint Your Wagon*, and *Camelot*.

Brigadoon tells the story about two young Americans who stumble into a misty Scottish valley and discover a village that has been asleep for a century. None of the villagers may leave or the spell will be broken. The plot is complicated by one of the Americans falling in love with a village girl, and then the accidental death of a jealous village boy who tries to run away.

The music of *Brigadoon* is wonderful. Mike and I did this show in 1983 for Crookston Community Theatre. We both loved the music and we were so excited to get the chance to do the show. We were equally as excited to direct it here on the Red River stage. The show lends itself to the intimacy of the space. We hope that our audience feels as though they are right in the middle of the town.

You will enjoy *Brigadoon* thoroughly if you can let yourself get lost in its magic. Let the beauty of what you see and hear carry you. Don't think too hard. The story's deepest message is stated by Mr. Lundie several times, "When you love someone enough, anything is possible."
