

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Annie is a Broadway musical based on the popular Harold Gray comic strip Little Orphan Annie, with music by Charles Strouse, lyrics by Martin Charnin and book by Thomas Meehan. The original Broadway production opened in 1977 and ran for nearly six years, setting a record for the Alvin Theatre (now the Neil Simon Theatre). It spawned numerous productions in many countries, as well as national tours, and won the Tony Award for Best Musical. The musical's songs "Tomorrow" and "It's the Hard Knock Life" are among its most popular musical numbers.

The original Broadway production was nominated for eleven Tony Awards and won seven, including the Best Musical, Best Score, and Best Book. The show closed on January 2, 1983, after a total of 2,377 performances, setting a record for the longest running show at the Alvin Theatre (Neil Simon Theatre), until it was surpassed by Hairspray in 2009.

Annie has been filmed for the screen three times, 1982, 1999, and 2014. In fact, if you want to have some fun, just consider the following: 2014's Annie is the remake of the 1999 film, which is a remake of the 1982 film, which is based off the 1977 musical, which is based off the 1920s comic strip, which was based off a 19th century poem, which was inspired by an orphan named Mary, who was born in 1850. Got it?

The New York Times estimates that Annie is produced 700 to 900 times each year in the United States.

The students involved in this production have worked very hard. Some students have years of training in dance, singing, acting and technical theatre. Others are involved in their first production ever, with only 21 days of rehearsal. 27 days to learn the music, choreography, blocking tracks, find or create props, build and paint a set, cue lights, find sound effects, learn how to operate microphones, etc. All the while, they bravely put themselves onstage and perform for complete strangers.

We at SPA are proud of each individual student, regardless of their individual skill or experience level, for being involved in a positive activity, and doing their best work possible.

Thank you so much for choosing to attend this production, the cast, crew and staff all hope you enjoy what we've prepared for you.

NOTES FROM THE SPA ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTOR

Each year the SPA program selects a theme for our character education part of the program. (This summer our theme is "Building Communities".)
