**DIRECTOR’S NOTES**

The animated film came out in 1991. It was the first Disney film to be translated to the stage and it opened on Broadway on April 18, 1994. It ran until 2007.

We looked at “Beauty and the Beast” for SPA after the Trollwood production and found that our stage was too small for the costumes! We set aside the idea for a time when there might be a larger stage. It only made sense to choose it for the first SPA production in the Performance Hall.

Beauty and the Beast will be the most demanding show we have ever attempted in the area of costumes and tech. Without “Disney Magic” there is just a simple, sweet story with some lovely music, much like any other musical. The visual element of surprise in this show does not come without the work and the dedication and the dollars of countless dedicated artists.

The production will use 9 drops, and 13 moving set pieces. It will feature costume pieces not found anywhere else. This is a huge jump from our traditional unit set designs that the old theater demanded. Our new hall forces us to grow as designers and artists by what it allows as possibilities.. We have found ourselves more than once this summer questioning the wisdom of jumping right in like this with a technical show this large. The number “Be our Guest” may easily be the most expensive production number in the history of theater! The entire cast needs to be dressed as dining room utensils. This took some real creativity on the part of Cassel and Amy.

Our community has been given a wonderful gift in this Performance Hall. The SPA staff decided to take the plunge and open big. The Disney Magic and the appeal of "Beauty and The Beast" may get people into the hall by the family appeal it carries. That is our hope.

Enjoy this “Tale as old as time, song as old as rhyme” and celebrate this beautiful space with us.

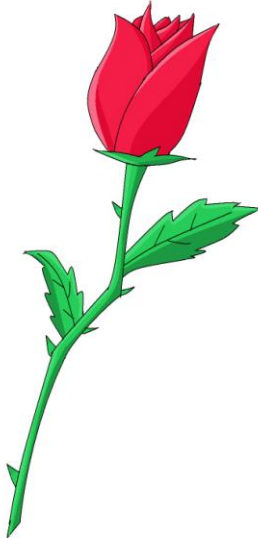

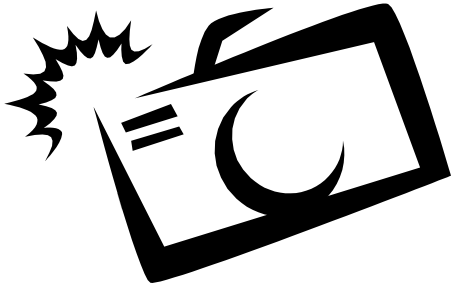
