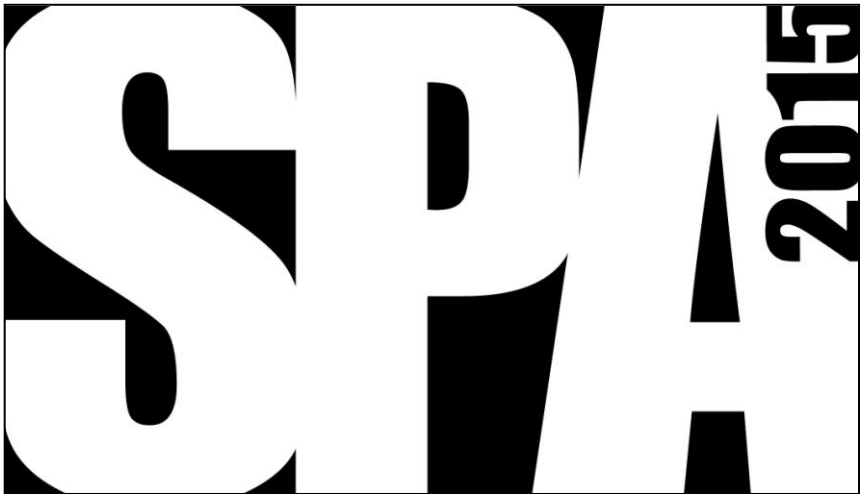

DIRECTOR’S NOTES

Peter Pan is a famous story. Everyone knows it. Not everyone knows that it was first a play and then a novel, written by J.M Barrie. The play was written in 1904 and was adapted into a novel in 1906. The musical adaptation of the play was written in 1954. Ironically it ran on Broadway with Mary Martin the same year that The Boy Friend was running, starring Julie Andrews in her first role. Peter Pan closed after only 154 performances, and the show was sold to NBC. It aired on television in 1955, 1956, and 1960.

Peter Pan has been revived on Broadway numerous times. Once starring Sandy Duncan and several times starring Cathy Rigby. Only one male has ever played Peter Pan on Broadway, and he did it in a Jerome Robbins revue. The role was originally written as a vehicle for Mary Martin, and has never been reconceived.

There are a number of reasons for selecting Peter Pan as the 2014 SPA production. The main one is because we can. We are proud of our new theater with its fly loft. Peter Pan is a production that cannot be done in any other space in town other than Chester Fritz. In that respect, this is a landmark SPA production. It is the first time that we have ever put actors in the air for any length of time.

5 of the characters in the production fly. In order to make a character fly, it takes more than just a space. It requires a flying company. The ZFX company brought the set and the flying expertise. Our actors and our operators spent approximately 30 hours in training to make the flight sequences happen. David Wilhelmi, the technical director from the Fargo Public Schools has been here assisting with the endeavor. What appears to happen by magic and a little bit of pixie dust is in fact a physics project that works something like a carnival ride. Every track and every landing is an exact science.

All theater is about creating magic. All teaching is about giving the best that you have to give at all times. The combination of staff and students giving the best they have and the physics project delivered by the ZFX company have created the production you will see. Peter Pan has been a learning experience for all of us.
